Introduction

Kayaking is assumed a risk sport, and carry some inherent risk. These risk assessments mitigate but can never completely remove this risk. All paddlers should therefore make their own assessments on risk before getting on the water.

Club Safety Officer: Appointed representative from the Club responsible for safety of the paddling session.

Coach: A person approved by the Club to act as a Coach on club session, whether they hold formal qualifications or not.

Coached Participants: Anyone paddling under the direct supervision of a Coach

MCC: Maldon Canoe Club

LVWWC: Lee Valley White Water Centre
